

Grading System

Each assignment is assigned a point value; the higher the point value the more preparation, thought and time required. A letter grade will then be assigned based on the state grading scale.

Grading Scale

A	90-100
B	80-89
C	70-79
D	60-69
F	59 or below

Grading Policies

- Quizzes may NOT be made up and will be given either with or without prior warning.
- Students will be notified a week in advance of an upcoming test. Various review strategies will be used to ensure student mastery prior to test day.
- No make-up tests will be given during class. Make up tests will be given on Wednesday *after* school. Students must schedule a make-up test time. A student who misses a test must make it up no later than the following Wednesday. After a week, 10 points a week will be deducted from the test grade until the test has been taken.
- A graded test may be revised once in order to obtain a higher score. Revised tests-
 - are due no later than a week after the test has been handed back
 - are to be done in a different color ink than the original test
 - are to be signed by a parent/guardian
 - tests that do not adhere to all three policies will not be accepted (no exceptions)
 - This does not apply to the Mid-Term or the Final Exam
- Students will be notified *at least* one week in advance of a project due date. Projects will be broken down into sections and time will be provided in class for completion of project sections. Often a parent/guardian's signature will be required for a section to be considered complete.
- Students who are absent the day a project is due will have 10 points deducted from that assignment. After a week, 10 points a week will be deducted from the project grade until the project has been passed in.
- For your protection-it is advised that a copy of all projects be saved on a flash/thumb drive. NO assignment will be accepted due to printer or computer problems or lack of ink.
- Cheating of any kind is unacceptable. Plagiarism, the process of copying another person's idea or written work and claiming it as original, is a form of cheating. Consequences for cheating include:
 - a zero for that assignment, test or project
 - a written referral
 - parent notification
